Born on May 16, 1930, in Sheboygan, Wisconsin, she was the daughter of the late Arthur and Loretta (Schultz) Byrum, and the beloved wife of her late husband Alvin Albers. Carol was also preceded in death by her sister, Janice Rohde.

Carol is survived by her daughters, Sharon Barr and Deborah Toombs; her grandchildren, Kimberly Bellace, Matthew Barr, Jason Mueller, Carolyn Martin, and David Toombs; and her great-grandchildren, Evelyn Mueller and Madison Martin, each of whom brought her immense pride and joy.

Carol attended Central High School in Sheboygan, where she sang in the a cappella choir--a fond memory that always brought a smile to her face. After graduating in June 1948, she briefly worked at H.C. Prange's Department Store before attending the Evangelical Deaconess School of Nursing in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. She graduated with her R.N. license in 1952.

On June 21, 1952, Carol married Alvin Albers at the Evangelical Zion Reformed Church in Sheboygan. The couple made their home in Milwaukee, where Carol began her nursing career. She worked in surgery before spending many years as a postpartum and neonatal intensive care nurse,

caring for others with the same quiet kindness that defined her life.

After retiring, Carol and Alvin moved to Texas to enjoy warmer weather and to be closer to their daughters, Sharon and Deborah, initially settling in Kingwood. Carol lived in an apartment attached to Sharon's home where she enjoyed her independence while staying close to family. Later, they shared a home. As Carol's health declined, Sharon lovingly cared for her needs. Both daughters ensured she was always comfortable, safe, and loved. Carol's grandchildren were never far away, visiting often and spending meaningful time together, providing their love and support.

Carol's final move was to Fate, Texas, with her daughter Sharon. Family was never far-- whether through visits or phone calls, she was always surrounded by love. She cherished her children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren and felt blessed to have known each of them.

Carol lived a quiet, simple life and found joy in life's small pleasures. She enjoyed latch-hooking rugs, cooking and baking for her family, watching birds in the backyard, keeping track of neighborhood happenings, and hearing updates about her family. She especially treasured her nightly glass of wine, Sharon's cat, Arthur--who often curled up in her lap or rode on her walker--and the flowers planted outside her window just for her enjoyment.

Quiet by nature, Carol was incredibly kind, sweet, and easy to love. Her smile and laughter were gifts to those around her, and her presence brought a sense of comfort that words cannot fully capture.

Carol was a Christian and was confirmed in her faith earlier in life.

A private funeral service will be held on Thursday, December 18, 2025, with visitation beginning at 1:30 p.m. and the service at 2:00 p.m. The family asks
