Cedric Jaggard was born in 1915 in Glen Ridge, NJ to Arthur and Grace Holman Jaggard. His brother was the Rev. Kenneth Jaggard. Cedric graduated from Montclair Academy in 1932, Dartmouth College in 1937, Haverford College in 1938, Union Theological Seminary in 1941 and received his doctoral degree in theology in 1950 from Princeton Theological Seminary. For his graduate work, he studied under theologians Karl Barth in Basel, Switzerland and Reinhold Niebuhr, New York City.

Cedric Jaggard married Jean Dale McGiffert June 24, 1943. They had three children, Keith, Dwight (Vangie) and Kim (Marc) Bierma.

The Rev. Dr. Jaggard served as a Presbyterian pastor in Valley Stream, NY, Philipsburg, NJ, Richfield, WI, and Cedar Grove, WI. He taught at Lafayette College, Easton, PA, Carroll College, Waukesha, WI and Milwaukee School of Engineering, Milwaukee, WI. He served as a chaplain in the U.S. Army Reserves.

After his pastoral and teaching careers, Cedric Jaggard bought and managed Oakton Manor to provide low-cost housing for the elderly in Milwaukee.

Dr. Jaggard is survived by his three children, his six grandchildren (Aaron, David, Damon, Kate, Peter and Katelyn) and seven great grandchildren

(Arielle, Elijah, Olive, Josef, Cohen, Kai and Thelma Ruth).
