Frances was born in Milwaukee, WI, she attended school in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee, graduated from Girls Trade and Technical H.S. in 1940 and married Henry Penkalski in 1941. A Charter Member of the St. Roman Parish, she helped form the Christian Women Society and was a member of the Polish Alliance. A beloved volunteer in the Gift Shop of St. Francis Hospital in Milwaukee where she provided over 7,000 hours of volunteer service over 30 years. Fran sang in the Wilsonnaires Choir at the Wilson Park Senior Center where she also led the Senior Exercise Groups and performed piano accompaniment and concerts at many events throughout the area. In addition to her accomplished piano skills she played accordion, enjoyed traveling, international vacations, crochet, and hosted countless large family gatherings. An avid reader, she

read and documented her book reviews at an average of two to three books per week. Her skills at playing cards, especially Sheepshhead, are legendary. She was kind, generous and compassionate and known for her gracious personality and putting the needs of others before her own. She will be missed by many and her family was fortunate to have her loving example in their lives.
