She was the best grandma anyone could ask for, and I am honored to have been given my middle name after such an amazing woman, who I truly admire. I have no doubt that the Lord has not only prepared a spot at His table for her, but a spot in His kitchen as well! I’ll always treasure the pride with which she and grandpa beamed when they watched me as a Krakow Polish dancer, and how even after nearly 2 decades of my illness, she still told me even a few weeks ago that she prayed every day that I will be cured someday and able to dance the Krakowiak again. No matter how much she was suffering, she never stopped praying for everyone else. I know that she and grandpa are polka-dancing in heaven, and that one day when I am there, whole and healed again, we will all dance

*together. When I got sick, she sent me letters in the mail all the time so I wouldn't feel alone and told me frequently how much she wished she could give me her healthy organs to heal me. That's how grandma was – she gave everything from love. One time when I told her that we were going to buy new dish towels, she told me that I should come take hers from her drawers instead. Of course we didn't, but she would have given someone the socks right off her feet if they needed them. I am grateful that grandma loved Kay from the moment she met him and will never forget how she told me that she always prayed every day until then that I would find someone to love me despite my health struggles. It made me smile to see the smile on her face in the pictures Kay sent me from his lunch dates with her at Clifden, and it was an honor for me to hunt down her favorites – liver and onions piled high with extra onions and bone-in breaded pork chops. I had a hard time finding them, and when several restaurants asked me if it really mattered if they had the bone, and I told them, "My 93 year old grandmother has specifically requested there be a bone..." and then they knew I meant business!
