Julia Hawley (nee Trantum) went home to God on September 20, 2020 at the age 95 years. She is preceded in death by Monroe, her husband of 71 years. She is survived by her children Wayne (Gayle) Hawley, Dale (Vicki) Hawley, Glynda (John) Giemza, and Glenn (Leanna) Hawley, her 12 grandchildren and 16 great-grandchildren.
