Harriet couldn't hear very well so I talked with Katie and got to know a lot about her. She really liked cucumber salad and lemon meringue pie. She told me a simple way to make the salad so I would make it for her. Other times I brought her a lemon meringue pie to share with other residents. She also liked to play Kings Corners, a card game, which she taught me to play. So after eating we would play in the front lobby with another friend, Joan, who Katie knew and I got to know. We would play for hours. Katie loved to play. After playing, sometimes I would take Katie and Joan to get ice cream at the little cafe. One time I went to get cones for all of us by myself, which seemed easier than getting them both there in their wheelchairs, but that was the last time I did that because the ice cream melted and they were a mess when I got them to Katie & Joan. That was a learning experience. Katie was always so excited to see me and told me how nice it was for me to come and visit. When I would leave she would say come back and visit again and she always told me that she loved me.

On Sunday 5-28, when I came to visit her she was in bed and didn't seem to be doing to well. I spent a lot of time with her holding her hand, talking with her, telling her she is a wonderful friend, how much I enjoyed all our visits together and that I loved her. She told me that she was ready to be with Jesus. It was as though she knew she was going to meet Him soon. When I left she squeezed my hand and told me again that she loved me. I am so thankful that I was able to spend time with her and pretty much say good-bye to her without actually saying good-bye.
