He married the love of his life, Dorothy or Dee (Joslin) on April 4, 2003 at St. Lucas Church, Milwaukee. Scott became a surrogate father to Dee's children Robert and Jacob. He would eventually adopt both boys as his own sons. He and Dorothy would go have two more boys, Caleb and Caden. As a proud father, Scott enjoyed coaching and playing baseball with his son, Caden, and practicing taekwondo with Caleb and Caden.

Scott's family will always remember him as being loyal and dedicated to his family. His wife, Dee, will always remember that her husband was her best friend, her strength, and her safe place. Robert thought of his dad as the duct tape of the family, holding everyone tightly together. He will always recall how

selfless his dad was and how Scott adopted him and Jacob without hesitation, forming a strong family unit together. Caleb saw how his father would help others in their time of need and how family and friends came first; something he would tell his children often.
